"Christmas, it's a busy time, a frenetic time for a lot of us! It's hard to relax and really focus on what happened that very first Christmas. Trying to find that one gift your aunt or uncle doesn't have and getting it to the Post Office, so it's arrives by the 25<sup>th</sup> is stressful. Resisting all the Holiday cookies and candies is stressful. Dealing with travel plans is stressful. Planning Christmas dinner is stressful.

We sacrifice our money, our sleep, our time, our serenity to make sure our family members know they are loved and appreciated at least one time a year – Christmas. It's easy for us to think that we are the only ones making sacrifices at Christmas time. It's easy to forget the sacrifice he made for us that very first Christmas.

I can hear you saying, "Now, wait a minute, pastor, He sacrificed himself for us on the cross and we remember that on Good Friday not Christmas." We think of how he sacrificed his life for us every time we participate in the Lord's Supper – "This is my body given for you.... This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood...." But he sacrificed much for

us that very first Christmas as well.

Listen to John's words in his gospel in chapter 1 verses 14-16, "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood. We saw the glory with our own eyes, the one-of-a-kind glory, like Father, like Son, Generous inside and out, true from start to finish." (The Message)

By moving into a new neighborhood, Bethlehem, He moved out of his old neighborhood – heaven.

Have you ever thought about that move for him and what it entailed? Paul tells us a little bit about that move in Philippians 2:5-11: "He (Jesus) had equal status with God but didn't think so much of himself that he had to cling to the advantages of that status no matter what. Not at all. When the time came, he set aside the privileges of deity and took on the status of a slave, became *human!* Having become human, he stayed human. It was an incredibly humbling process. He didn't claim special privileges."

Eugene Peterson in The Message translates the Greek word, *ekenosen*, "set aside the privileges of deity." The New International Version translates this word,

The Formula of Concord Epitome (VII 15-16) which we believe, teach and confess states that the Lord Jesus "always had his divine majesty. Yet, he abstained from using it in the state of his humiliation – being a man – and because of this he truly increased in wisdom and favor with God and men. Therefore, he did not use his majesty but only when it pleased him."

Not only did Jesus sacrifice his life for us on Calvary, he also, sacrificed his majesty and any and all privileges associated with that when he agreed to let go of his rightful place in heaven, and be born of a Virgin in Bethlehem.

May we remember the sacrifice He made for us not only on Good Friday but also, on Christmas morning.
