It's that time of the church year again! What time, you ask? That time when we take a good hard look at ourselves and attempt by God's grace and the power of the Holy Spirit to change our sinful attitudes and actions. Your favorite time and mine, Lent!

Being raised Catholic, we were always to give up something for Lent. I would give up the standard items like certain television shows, radio or some culinary delight or libation. But my spiritual thirst for "Living Water" did not increase.

One year I gave up Coke Zero for Lent. Needing six or so of those caffeine injections every day, it amounted to a big sacrifice for me to just say, no, to Coke Zero. However, I found a way to circumvent this attempt at sacrifice. I simply substituted Diet Coke for Coke Zero. Like the Pharisees, I kept the letter of the Law but not the spirit. I didn't slack my thirst anymore with Coke Zero but there was even more caffeine in Diet Coke. And learning that Sundays were feast days, I could satisfy my Coke

Zero cravings and have as many as I wanted that day.

If you think this is spiritual gamesmanship, you are correct. I didn't slack my spiritual thirst for Living Water at all. Giving up Coke Zero, didn't draw me any closer to the Lord.

Now, just so you know, at least I didn't look depressed or gloomy, so others didn't know I had given up Coke Zeroes. I wasn't as bad as the hypocrites Jesus mentioned in Matthew 5:16-17, who wanted everyone to know they were fasting. Give me a little credit for crying out loud! But I felt like I was fulfilling my Lenten obligation to sacrifice something to increase my spiritual focus.

But isn't it interesting that even a spiritual discipline can be diverted from its goal to draw us closer to the Lord? Our flesh is like that. Always trying to elevate self, reward self, applaud self for being so righteous even when our motives fall far short of love for the Lord and our neighbors.

I came across what A.W. Tozer called "Hyphenated Sins." These are self-sins – self-righteousness, self-pity, self-sufficiency, self-admiration, self-love. There are others, self-promotion, self-expression, self-esteem. I've yet to decide which ones I will preach on during Lent each Wednesday night.

Now, you are probably saying why would I go to hear sermons about self-absorption?

Recently, I read a blog on www.patheos.com by Lutheran writer, Gene Veith, entitled Luther's Remedy for Self-Absorption. In it Veith quoted LCMS Pastor Burfeind who wrote an article for *The Federalist* entitled, "How Our Age's Melancholy Stems from Loving Ourselves Too Much." There Burfeind said, "During Melancthon's bouts of depression Luther would direct him "extra nos," or "outside of himself," to Christ and everything Christ implied, including his church, the Sacraments, the Scriptures."

Hopefully, this Lent as we look at our hyphenated sins, we will allow God's Word to penetrate our souls and take us, "extra nos" so, as Luther would say, we are not "curved in on ourselves."

During Lent, may our focus be on the cross and may we remember what Paul said in Galatians 2:20, "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave himself for me."

FROM THE DESK OF THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Throughout history when Godly men and women were desperate for God's intervention, they forsook food (fasted) and laid their needs bare at the throne of God. Often during this dedicated time of prayer, **God made His heart clear** to those who asked in Acts 13:2-3.

National fasts were proclaimed in times of great trouble, 2 Chronicles 20:3. Individuals facing personal crisis paused from their **daily** routine to fast and plead their case before the Lord, 2 Samuel [12:16](#), and others needing clarity as to the mind of God sought Him through fasting, Daniel 9:3. It was during the routine of fasting that God revealed to the early church His desire that Paul and Barnabas be set apart for ministry, Acts 13:2, and these same men be released to take the Gospel to "the uttermost parts of the earth," Acts 1:8, 13:3. Jesus assumed that fasting would be common among those committed to Him giving us instructions in Matthew [6:16](#).

What was a regular practice among Godly men and women seeking God's direction seems to have taken a back seat for our generation. The **idea** of forsaking food for any length of time has lost its appeal in our fast paced world where information on just about everything is readily available from a variety of "other" sources than the God of heaven.

We are on a **faith journey** and together we must seek God's leading as it relates to looking forward to achieve our goals for the future of our church. How can you be involved in this effort? I'm extending every member and friend of this church an **invitation to join me in a fast**. *I'm asking you to substitute one meal each week, starting the first week of March, for eight consecutive weeks, to seek the heart of God. I'm asking that you use the time allocated to consume that meal to fast and to ask God questions and to listen to His responses. Write down what you learn and be prepared to discuss them at **cottage meetings** that will be set up in May.*

The week of [March 1](#), we should focus on capturing God's vision of success. Read passages from 2 Timothy 2-4 asking the question, "What would our city look like in ten years if our **vision** for ministry was successfully accomplished?"

The week of [March 8](#), we should focus on growing through relationships. Read Romans 16 asking the question, "How do people benefit from their **relationship** with me? How do people benefit from God's relationship with me?"

The week of [March 15](#), we should focus on using gifts to serve. Read 1 Corinthians 12 asking the question, "What have people told me all my life that **I do well** that I have categorically dismissed as being insignificant because it is so easy for me? How can I use that to impact the Kingdom of God?"

The week of [March 22](#), we should focus on God's invitation to test Him. Read Malachi 1-4 asking the question, "Why am I **sometimes** reluctant to believe God means exactly what He says?"

The week of **March 29**, we should focus on **discipleship**. Read Matthew 14:22-33 asking the question, "What acts of faith would I do if I had assurance of God's presence in my life?"

The week of **April 5**, we should focus on the wonder of worship. Read Psalm 91 asking the question, "How can I **express my love and devotion to God?**"

The week of **April 12**, we should focus our relationship with God through prayer. Read Numbers 22-25 asking the question, "What are the barriers in my life that keep me from hearing **God speaking** to me?"

The week of **April 19**, we should focus on responding to God. Read 2 Corinthians 9 asking the question, "How would God have me involved in **growing** our church?"

Your journey with me will only encompass 1% of your waking life (assuming you sleep 8 hours each night). Please join me as we take this journey **together** to discern God's will for the growth of our church. Glory to God!!

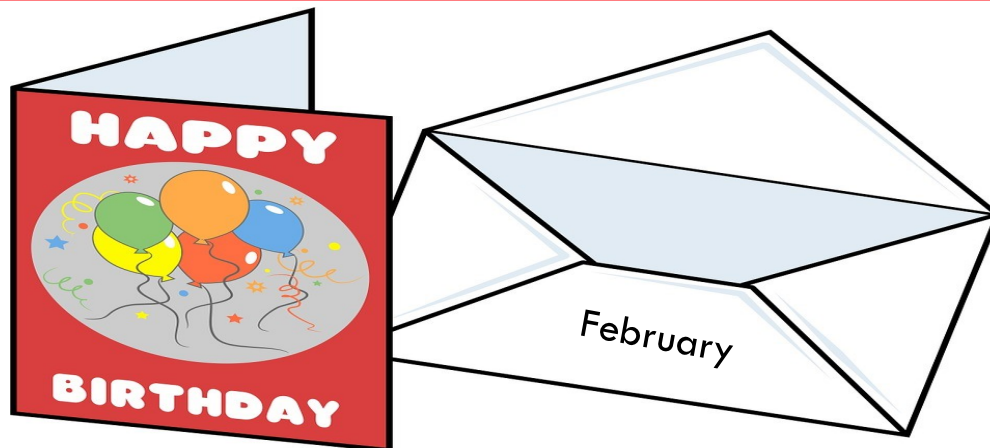
