America, America God shed his grace on thee And crown thy good with brotherhood From sea to shining sea

These lyrics to America the Beautiful seem to be out of sync right now. "And crown thy good with brotherhood from sea to shining sea" just isn't happening. In fact, I read a report that America is more divided than ever. Maybe we need to get back to the earlier part of that stanza, "God shed his grace on thee."

As James tells us in the opening chapter verse 18, "Every good and perfect gift is from above." Living where we do, here in the USA, #LoveUtah, is a blessing but it seems as though many have forgotten that.

My grandfather, Bruno Albert Grentz, Sr. got off the boat in New York City. He had emigrated from Germany. The culinary arts were his forte. He worked as a chef at major hotels in Philly, DC and in the summers, Summit Springs, Maine. But they didn't speak German in his house as Germans weren't looked on very favorably back then. He worked 12 hours a day, 6 days a week. He died while working on the hottest day of the summer of 1954. His death is my earliest memory. I would rather my earliest memory be of our family feeding ducks at a pond or something less abrupt than the death of a grandparent.

But I am so grateful that my grandfather came to America, became a legal citizen, worked his tail off, as Germans tend to do, and established a home in the USA. And I am thankful for all of our members who have served in the military to defend and preserve what the Declaration of Independence asserts: We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness....

We, as believers, need to defend these tenets of the Declaration of Independence and particularly, at this time, that all men and women are created equal and everyone has God-given rights of Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness. I'm sure all of us have ideas as to what needs to happen in the good, ol' US of A to quell the riots and restore peace so we might live quiet and sober lives. Paul told Timothy for this to happen we need to start with prayer. In I Timothy 2:1-4, Paul says, "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—² for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.³ This is good, and pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth."

Also, may we always remember as believers in Christ alone for our salvation we have dual citizenship. In Philippians 3:20, Paul tells us this: But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ.... This isn't our final destination. One day, al believers will be in their real country, heaven.

John Wesley expresses how we are to live until we have moved to our real home country, heaven. He tells us to

"Do all the good you can,

By all the means you can, In all the ways you can, In all the places you can, At all the times you can, To all the people you can, As long as ever you can."

May we do everything we can by God's grace and the power of the Spirit for our neighbor's good and God's glory as long as we ever can.


