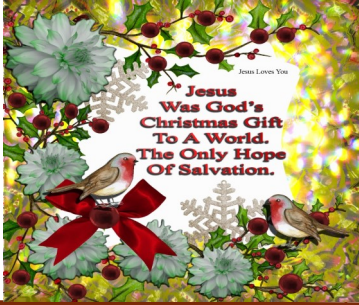

## Disinformation about Jesus

As we continue to be flooded with information about the Steele Dossier, the Rittenhouse Trial, parents and local school board meetings, the cost of a pound of bacon, fentanyl deaths and thousands of people coming to our southern border, it's hard to believe Advent and Christmas are right around the corner. But they are. It's not easy to extricate ourselves from the cacophony around truth, disinformation, and misinformation to hear Christmas carols, hymns, and songs like "Mary, Did You Know?"

Mary didn't know that things would get this complicated, but Jesus did. He came into this world even though he knew what was ahead for him and us. His death started with his birth because he came to die in our place to satisfy God's wrath against our sin (1 John 4:9-10). He was the only perfect, eternal sacrifice there has ever been so our sins could be forgiven through faith in Him alone for all eternity (Ephesians 2:8-9).

But what is the difference between misinformation and disinformation? Misinformation is a simple mistaken information like saying Jesus was born in Jerusalem. He was born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2, Mt 2:1).

On the other hand, disinformation,

as defined by Merriam- Webster is "false information deliberately and often covertly spread (as by the planting of rumors) in order to influence public opinion or obscure the truth." I also heard someone say that disinformation isn't interested in any facts. It is false information deliberately used to create a false narrative that besmirches one's character and personality.

In Genesis 3:5, we see the originator of disinformation, the Devil himself. There, he tells Eve and Adam that if they eat the fruit of the tree or the knowledge of good and evil, they will not surely die as the Lord had told them. No, Satan tells them they will be like God knowing good from evil. Satan obscured the truth to them so they would reject God's command and take all humanity into sin.

Herod used misinformation to obscure from the Wise Men his real motives for wanting to see the Christ-child. In Matthew 2:8 we see that he propagated disinformation about his reason for wanting the Wise Men to find the child, King. Herod wanted to create a narrative that he, too, like the Wise Men, wanted to worship Jesus when he really wanted to kill this child who threatened his power and influence.

But Herod isn't the only one who spread disinformation about Jesus. Many spread as much disinformation as they could because their Messiah had to be a military ruler who would restore the kingdom of Israel, not a suffering servant like we see in Isaiah 53.

Other examples of disinformation about Jesus, are found in John 8:41 where the Jewish leaders claimed Jesus was an illegitimate son. Others said he was a glutton and a drunkard (Mt. 11:19), a man acting without authority (Mt. 21:23), a blasphemer (Mt. 26:65), a false prophet (Luke 22:64), a false Christ (Luke 22:35,39), a demoniac (John 8:48), and a breaker of the Sabbath (Luke 13:14). These accusations were not based in facts.

This Christmas you might hear disinformation like, Jesus was a good man like other good men that we should emulate, or he was a sinner just like us or there are many ways to God not Jesus alone. Well, he wasn't only a good man; he was without sin who became sin for us so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him (2 Corinthians 5:21). Also, Jesus said that He is the way, the truth, and the life and that no one comes to the Father but through Him (John 14:6).

When it comes to fighting disinformation about Jesus, Peter gives us the ultimate encouragement. In 1 Peter 3:15, he tells us, "but in our hearts to honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect." This Advent, may we be ready to give true information to anyone who asks us about Jesus the Christ, the Son of the Living God, who loved us and came to this earth to give himself for us.
