A Mid-Summer Night's Reality

Here we are in mid-summer. It's hot, more humid than I've felt here. Texas style gully washers even visited us a few days late in the afternoon. A couple of days in July, reminded me of Dallas – high temp, high humidity. Utah is Shangri-la comparatively. Why would anyone want to be in Dallas? It's nothing but concrete, glass, high walls cordon off homes - only minus the barbed wire - remember without barbed wire the west would have never been settled.

So how have you spent your summer? You're wondering how we spent ours so far? Not really but I'll share how anyway. Thus far, we have done some day trips as my childhood buddy, Bruce Becker's family called them. I was blessed to be taken to Steel Pier in Atlantic City, NJ, where the woman on a horse plunged 40 feet into a deep tub of water. In the spirit of the Becker's day trips, now known as Staycations, we have gone to Thanksgiving Point, Lagoon and the movies.

One Monday in the middle of July, my wife, Minuette, suggested we all go see Top Gun: Maverick. Well, maybe you don't know this but I'm not a movie guy. Never really have been. Although, I do remember seeing the

"Bridge Over the River Kwai" for a nickel at the Waverly – one screen only, no surround sound and black juicy fruits stuck under the seats – theater in Drexel Hill, PA. But Top Gun: Maverick was different. Yes, we had all the amenities - the cushy seats that reclined – check. Surround sound – check. Popcorn, candy and drinks – check. No juicy fruits stuck under the seats. Not the Waverly, for sure!

Not being a "movie guy," I'm certainly not a sequel guy! I recoil at the idea of Home Alone 16! How many ways can they leave their kid at home? Needless to say, I wasn't thinking the sequel to a movie made 30 years ago would be that good. But it was!

Having seen the original movie, has it really been thirty years, I wondered what could the plot be that would break all box office records? But after seeing the sequel, I get it. I was sucked right into the drama between Goose's son, aka - Rooster, and Maverick, Pete Mitchell (Tom Cruise). Rooster's father, Goose, was Maverick's wing man who was killed while trying to eject thirty years earlier. It turns out that Maverick pulled Rooster's papers for the Naval Academy because he made a promise to Goose's wife, Rooster's mom before she died, that he wouldn't let Rooster become a flyboy like his dad.

Rooster, not knowing why Maverick had done that, hated him but fortunately or unfortunately, Maverick was now going to train Rooster for a ridiculously difficult mission. Eventually, Maverick leads the mission and makes Rooster his wing man, who winds up saving Maverick's life.

By now, you're saying, "Pastor, I'm glad you went to the movies but what does this have to do with anything remotely spiritual? Top Gun was a tremendous story of forgiveness, grief – thirty years later that Maverick still had to work through - and self-sacrifice.

One scene made me think of Jesus and what he might have said to his Father when asked to go to earth and pay for our sins. The mission that Maverick was working on with many others was about to be scrubbed for not meeting their goal two months early of surviving 10 g's of force while in the air.

Maverick decided to prove to all that it could be done so the mission could continue. But right before he made the decision to show his superiors it

could be done, one of his team members, Hondo, said to him, "You don't have to do this. You know what's going to happen to you if you do this." With that, Maverick responded, "I know what's going to happen to everyone else if I don't."

I thought of Jesus when Maverick said that. Jesus wasn't forced by God the Father to leave heaven to go to the cross to pay the penalty for our sins. No, he willingly came. Remember in John 10:18 Jesus said, "No one takes it (my life) away from me, but I lay it down of my own free will." (NET)

I could see God the Father saying the same to Jesus that Hondo said to Maverick, "You know what's going to happen to you if you do this." And Jesus responding, "I know what's going to happen to everyone else if I don't." He didn't and still doesn't want anyone to perish and spend eternity separated from Him, God the Father and the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 3:9). But He knew He had to suffer once for our sins, the righteous for the unrighteous so we could be brought to God (1 Peter 3:18).

Jesus knew what was going to happen to everyone else if he didn't die on the cross to pay for our sins. He didn't consider holding onto his glory as important as dying for us on the cross. Summertime is a time where it can be all about us but the mid-summer night's reality for me was that Jesus was all about others and loving them sacrificially. Are we about the same?
