Pastor's Message

Scary or Scared

October – an evil month or a harmless month for taming our fears of all things scary? The tradition originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, when people would light bonfires and wear costumes to ward off ghosts. In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1 as a time to honor all saints. Soon, All Saints Day incorporated some of the traditions of Samhain. The evening before was known as All Hallows Eve, and later Halloween. (www.history.com)

Apparently, Pope Gregory wanted to sanctify this night by making the next day, November 1 All Saints Day – a holy day of obligation. Catholics have to attend Mass on those holy days or risk committing a mortal sin which unconfessed sends you right past go into everlasting darkness. He had the right idea of sanctifying (setting it apart for godly purposes) it instead of going along with the pagan culture. Since then, it's lost it's connection to paganism for most people and simply become a night of dressing up, having fun and asking neighbors for a treat – usually candy of some kind, although Mrs. McGuinness who lived around the corner from us gave out 6 bottles of Pepsi to the first 6 kids to her house. You bet I was one of those 6 kids!

But this whole issue of Halloween for me is more about evil than candy, goblins, ghosts, scary costumes or carved out pumpkins – used to be turnips in Northern European countries to scare away evil spirits. It reminds me, and hopefully us, that there is a spiritual battle roaring around us. It's easy to think evil is out there in the world but may I

remind you Adam and Eve were not to eat from only one tree in the garden – the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Paul affirms that he too, like Adam, had eaten from that same tree when he said in Romans 7:18, 19, **"For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature.^[C]** For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing."

Paul owned that he was both a sinner and a saint. But what is evil? Is it simply the absence of good like cold is the absence of heat? Or is evil simply a violation of the Ten Commandments like the men who murdered 3000 people when they flew jets into the Twin Towers? Yes, for sure, but evil is nuanced as well; it can be much more subtle.

In a blog by D.C. Robertson entitled "Biblical Perspectives on Narcissism," Robertson, refers to M. Scott Peck's book, **People of the Lie.** Robertson tells us that "**Peck** characterizes evil as a malignant type of self-righteousness in which there is an active rather than passive refusal to tolerate imperfection (sin) and its consequent guilt. This syndrome results in a projection of evil onto selected specific innocent victims often children, which is the paradoxical mechanism by which the People of the Lie commit their evil. Peck argues that these people are the most difficult of all to deal with, and extremely hard to identify. Amen, to that!!

We must remember the temptation in the garden for Adam and Eve was to become their own gods. This remains the temptation for all of us – falling in love with our image – as the Pharisees did – and demanding others fall in love with our image and worship us as well.

If we are own gods, then we are not submitted to the Lord of Lords and King of Kings. Erich Fromm (The Art of Loving) called attention to a variant of narcissism, a **"malignant narcissism that is characterized by an unsubmitted will."**

Peck agreed with Fromm when he said, "To a greater or lesser degree, all mentally healthy individuals submit themselves to the demands of their own conscience. Not so the evil, however. In the conflict between their guilt and their will, it is the guilt that must go and the will that must win." <u>Peck, The People of the Lie, Simon and Schuster, Inc., copyright © 1983, pg. 77-78</u>

May our wills never win at the expense of the Lord's will. May we make this October a sacred month by remembering it's all about His will and not ours. With every mention of ghosts and goblins, fright nights and ancient traditions, may we say and pray, **"Not my will but thine be done."**




