Pastor's Message

Epiphany – The Revelation of God

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi<sup>[a]</sup> from the east came to Jerusalem<sup>2</sup> and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." (Matthew 2:1-2)

Advent and Christmas went by at a record pace. I can't believe it's 2023. But more importantly, it is the Liturgical season of Epiphany. This season starts the first Sunday after January 6<sup>th</sup>, the traditional day where it is believed the Magi, the three Gentile Kings, Melchior, Balthazar and Caspar visited the baby Jesus. Their trip covered over 800 – 900 miles. They brought gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh to the newborn king, Jesus.

The liturgical season of Epiphany or the season of lights begins with evening prayer on January 5<sup>th</sup> to the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. This season emphasizes Jesus' manifestation (or epiphany from the Greek epiphaneia) as God and man. When these Gentile Magi came to worship Jesus, it showed that everyone, Jew and Gentile, had access to God.

Some scholars think that Jesus may have been as old as two when they arrived in Jerusalem. The reason for that is Herod had all the infants two years old or younger slaughtered so possibly, Jesus may have been around two. However, tradition paints the nativity scene with them in it suggesting they arrived right after he was born.

In an article by Dwight Longenecker in Crossroads.com, he suggests that there are 5 myths surrounding the Wise Men or Magi.

Myth #1 – There were only three wise men. We assume there were three because only three gifts were given but there might have been more.

Myth #2 – **The Wise Men rode camels**. This is a common misperception based on what we observe in movies from that area. Camels were pack mules that carried supplies. People of means rode Arabian horses and it's more likely they rode this swifter form of transportation.

Myth #3 – **They followed a miraculous star.** Matthew never says they followed a star. History teaches us this was the Northern Star. These men were astronomers who saw the star and knew it was a prophecy of the arrival of the Jewish king.

Myth #4 – **They were kings**. Magi were an advisory board to kings, but they weren't kings. We see in Daniel that they were consulted by the king and by Pharaoh in the time of Joseph.

Myth #5 – **They came from India, Persia or Africa.** Matthew says they came from the East but more than likely, they came from Arabian kingdom of Sheba. Longenecker contends Arabia had vast amounts of gold as well as the trees from which frankincense and myrrh were derived. Usually, the best commodities from one's country would be given to a neighboring king, so Sheba in Arabia is the best guess for the area they were from.

The question I have for us is how will God manifest himself to us in 2023? Are we looking for him to show up in our lives, in our church in 2023? The Magi were! When they saw indications of where he might be, they travelled 800 to 900 miles to worship him. Are we willing to do whatever we have to follow Him, to worship Him? They were. Are we willing to bring our gifts of our time, talents and treasure to worship Him? They were.

In this season of Epiphany, from January 6<sup>th</sup> to the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, I ask all of us, will we be like the Magi?


# <u>Service & Outreach Ministry:</u> Ashley Kaiser (Chairman) – Leo Seeber (Council Liaison)
