Pastor's Message The Joy of Lent

Say what? The joy of Lent. How can there be joy in a time of self-examination and penitence? I've been reading a book by Esau McCaulley, an assistant professor of New Testament at Wheaton College and a contributing opinion editor for the New York Times. He's written a book for entitled, Lent. Catchy title, huh? But Lent isn't supposed to be the most marketable of Church seasons. It doesn't come close to Advent anymore or Halloween. Wait, Halloween isn't a church season – just wanted to see if you are paying attention.

In the opening to his book on Lent, McCaulley makes this statement: "Lent, then, is about turning away from our sins and toward the living God. A season dedicated to repentance and renewal should not lead us to despair; it should lead us to praise God for His grace."

Lent, a time of renewal, I hadn't thought about that way. Being raised Catholic, I always had the impression it was about giving things up that hindered our faith or were just plain bad for us, spiritually, physically or emotionally. Lent was all about giving up TV, radio, ice cream and even soap operas as we all know watching "As the Stomach Turns" isn't a positive spiritual experience.

Clearly, even though as Martin Luther told us in his Ninety-Five Theses that we should repent every day, Lent is a special dedicated time of repentance. It can be either a time of initial repentance and baptism as it was for candidates for baptism in the early church or a time of renewal for believers. McCaulley asserts, "The goal of beginning again and beginning for the first time is the same. We are seeking communion with the risen Lord."

The early church moved from extemporaneous, on the spot baptisms as evidenced in Acts 2 – Pentecost and Acts 8 – Philipp and the Ethiopian Eunuch, to a time of preparation for those desiring to become Christians.

According to McCaulley, Lent came to be about three things: (1) preparation of new converts, (2) the reconciliation of those estranged from church and (3) a general call to the whole church to repent and renew its commitment to Jesus.

It's clear Lent is about repentance - changing our minds about ourselves, our sin - and wanting to do God's will instead of our own. But how can Lent renew us as McCaulley says it can?

Professor McCaulley refers us to the Anglican liturgy for Lent. He says, "All the prayers of Lent assume a loss of zeal. Over time we get comfortable in our sins. They become a part of who we are, a portion of the spiritual architecture of our lives. They are a limp we get used to walking with. Ash Wednesday (and Lent) is a call to remember our first years of our journey with God. Sin must become repulsive again. We need our hearts set aflame with love for God."

He contends part of the Collect for Ash Wednesday helps our hearts rekindle our love for the Lord. It reads, "Create and make in us new and contrite hearts, that we, worthily lamenting our sins and acknowledging our wretchedness, may obtain of thee, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness through Jesus Christ our Lord." Amen.

McCaulley contends that "this prayer shows us we cannot be healed of sins we refuse to acknowledge. There is no greater joy or relief than to know we are forgiven by God. The first step in receiving that forgiveness is in seeing them for what they are. In order to do that, we need hearts that are made new over and over again, because untended our hearts grow cold and unresponsive."

Remember God is rich in mercy (Ephesians 2:4) and he has plenty of grace to go around. His very nature is one of grace. Ash Wednesday and Lent lead us to a recognition of our sinfulness but it also, as the old hymn tells us, should lead us to a recognition of "grace, grace, God's grace, grace that is greater than all my sin." That's the joy of Lent.




