Leaping into Lent

Our Ash Wednesday service is behind us and now we head full bore into Lent. The purpose of Lent is both repentance and recovery. Psalm 51 shows us how both of these themes were expressed by King David.

Psalm 51 is David's response to being confronted by the prophet Nathan about his adultery and murderous behavior toward her husband, Uriah. David had been in total denial acting more like someone without a conscience than a man after God's own heart. But his response to Nathan's confrontation assures us that he was the man mentioned in Acts 13:22. There Paul said, "I have found David son of Jesse, a man after my own heart; he will do everything I want him to do."

David fell off the narrow road for sure. It's easy for us to judge him and say, "How could he?" But maybe if we were king for a day and had the same amount of power and good will that he had we might have done the same. Hopefully, none of us fall off the narrow road like David did but may we not think we are impervious to falling into the ditch alongside it. Jesus' brother, James, tells us in his epistle in chapter 3 verse 2, "We all stumble in many ways." Lent is a time for examining ourselves not others.

Psalm 51 shows us how David repented of his sin and how he sought recovery from his sins. He appeals to God for forgiveness and appeals to his mercy in verses 1-3. In verses 3-4, he says, "For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.⁴ Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge.

Notice he calls what he did sin. He doesn't call it a problem, a weakness, a foible, a shortcoming. He calls it what God calls it – sin. He violated both the 5^{th} and 6^{th} commandments.

That's what God asks of us in 1 John 1:9 where John says, "**If we confess our sins**, **He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins.**" The word "confess" is the Greek word homologeo. Homo means same and logeo means to speak or say. God asks us to call whatever we've done the same that God does. He calls it sin. The word sin is harmartia which means to miss the mark. Like an archer who misses the bulls eye, when we sin we miss the bulls eye of God's holiness, his will, his law. We miss the mark of giving Him glory. Instead, we give ourselves the glory. That constitutes sin.

David admits he's been a sinner even while in his mother's womb and asks God to forgive him. Clearly, David repented, metanoeo – changed his mind, about his evil actions. All the way through verse 9, he admits his sin and asks God for forgiveness. In verses 10 through 19, we see David asking God to help him recover from his sin. In verse 10, he asks God to "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me." And in verse 12, he continues, "Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me." Notice he doesn't say the joy of my salvation. Instead, he says, "The joy of your salvation." He knows he does not deserve to be saved and that he can't save himself. Salvation is from the Lord and he knows now he needs his initial joy in the Lord's salvation restored to him.

Once his joy is restored, he promises God that he **will teach transgressors your ways, so that sinners will turn back to you**.

David's faith has been restored and renewed. He now knows that God values a broken and contrite spirit. Before all this with Bathsheba, he was a proud, arrogant individual. David has come to the end of his pride and knows that God never despises a broken person. This Lent may we examine ourselves through God's Word and repent, change our minds about our sin. Let's simply call it sin and ask God to forgive us and help us stay broken of our pride not only in Lent but all year long.

OSLC COUNCIL PRESIDENT: John Deitsch

During my time as Council President, many of our members have expressed what they feel are serious concerns, some of which have existed for a long time. I have tried to listen to these concerns and ensure that they were properly addressed, but the number of members with concerns, and the history around some of these concerns, has made this very difficult. For this reason, I asked the Congregational Council to approve reaching out to LCMC to take advantage of trained counselors. Utilizing the LCMC has given every member with a concern the opportunity to express it to an unbiased party; and now the counselors will sort through what they've heard and then make recommendations to the Council on how to address the concerns that were expressed as well as any underlying causes. I believe that every member of this congregation deserves to be heard and to know that their concerns will be taken into consideration. I might add, in my mind members caring enough to speak up is a very good thing, so long as it is done in the proper way and does not unnecessarily sow discord.

Also, I noted back in November the emergence of certain factions within our congregation, but that was more as a caution to each of us than it was an indication that we are a divided church. It is natural to gravitate toward those with similar viewpoints, opinions, and backgrounds, but we must be careful when we do this that we don't shut out other views, or do not respect the opinions of others. Despite what social media and the news would lead you to believe, very seldom is anyone 100% right, or 100% wrong, and we can almost always learn from each other. We need to remain open minded and not easily take offense when a differing view is expressed. We need to keep the big picture in mind and not make it all about us, but rather about what is best for the entire congregation. Diversity can be a strength, but only if we don't lose focus on our point of commonality. Despite whatever differences we have, do we not all share the desire, as expressed in our Mission Statement, to be a scripture based, welcoming fellowship of believers who proclaim the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, and who, through our support of and connecting with each other, the local community, and the children of God everywhere, strive to love Christ and all others?

The evidence clearly shows that our shared faith in our Triune God, and our commitment to our church, is thus far clearly winning out over any divisiveness that may exist. Attendance at Sunday Worship Services remains fairly strong, if not on the rise. Financial giving is consistent with previous years and giving for January 2023 exceeded giving for January 2022. As we continue to host more opportunities for fellowship and growth, volunteerism for and participation in these events is strong. And we continue to

reach out to each other and our community with heartily supported service project activities. All this gives me great encouragement that we are not so much divided, as we are challenged; and that rather than retreating from the challenges we face, as a congregation we are rising to the occasion to move forward in faith. I thank everyone for your commitment to our church, or more precisely God's church; and I respectfully request that you continue to pray, have faith, stay strong, and trust in the Lord's plan, wherever that may lead us.


