Narcissism – we hear this world all the time when some of the news media describes politicians. It's almost overused at this juncture in our history. If defined accurately and used appropriately, it is a useful word to describe our fallen nature and resultant behavior.

But what are the origins of this word, narcissism? In 1899, the term was coined by German psychiatrist, Paul Nacke, on a comparison suggested in 1898 by Havelock Ellis. The term is derived from the Greek mythology of Narcissus. Narcissus was the name of a beautiful youth in mythology who fell in love with his own reflection in a spring and was turned into the flower, Narcissus. The reality is that Narcissus never saw his bad side, his imperfect side. He only saw the reflection of his good side in the pond. Narcissists don't see their not so perfect side. They are aware of it but hide it so that neither they nor anyone else can see it.

Unfortunately, we are all born narcissists. As Augustine observed and Luther developed further, we are "incurvatus in se," curved in on oneself. Luther in his commentary on Romans described our state this way, "Our nature, by the corruption of the first sin, [being] so deeply curved in on itself that it not only bends the best gifts of

God towards itself and enjoys them and viciously seeks all things, even God, for its own sake." Isn't this what happened in the garden when Satan offered Adam and Eve the promise of becoming their own gods? I think it was. We see this in a person mentioned in John's third epistle where John says, "I wrote to the church, but Diotrephes, who loves to be first, will not welcome us. 10 So when I come, I will call attention to what he is doing, spreading malicious nonsense about us." Narcissists have to be first and will do their best to destroy anyone who doesn't worship them. Notice he spread malicious nonsense about John so people would stop following John and follow him.

So, what does sanctification have to do with this? I think sanctification is God the Holy Spirit's work in reducing our inherent narcissism. Our fallen nature wants to take us to god-like status where others worship us. Initially, parents give us that feeling that we are the center of the universe and everyone revolves around us.

Dr. Paul Warren who was the medical director of the Adolescent Psychiatric Unit I was program director and lead therapist of, would always say to me, "We have to wound their narcissism." We had a lot of kids on our unit who had a basic sense of entitlement that needed to be minimized. As we grow, one of the main tasks of parenting is to wound their child's narcissism. Wounding their narcissism cannot be done in a mean-spirited way but just enough at different times to let children know they are not the center of the universe.

God the Father, our ultimate parent, wounds our narcissism as well through various ways. The primary way is by subjecting us to trials or tests. This is why James tells us in James 1:2, "Consider it all joy when you fall into various trials." Why should we consider trials as joy? James answer that question for us in verses 3 and 4. There he says, "because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance. 4 And let endurance have its perfect effect, so that you will be perfect and complete, not deficient in anything." Perfect is the Greek word, telios, which means mature, wanting nothing necessary to completeness, consummate human integrity and virtue. Sounds like Jesus to me. To be a mature Christian, we have to take up our cross daily and follow him knowing that the Holy Spirit is conforming us to be like the Lord Jesus (Romans 8:29) who was other-centered not self-centered. No. Jesus was not a narcissist. He loved us and gave himself for us because he wanted to be with us for all eternity and share heaven with us. He wanted us to experience his love, grace and mercy. So, this summer may the Lord continue to shrink our narcissism through his word, trials, the means of grace, and anything else he might use to help us realize, He's God and we're not! This summer may we truly say with John the Baptizer, the patron saint of sanctification, (just kidding) "He must increase; I must decrease." (John 3:30).

Even when we went through the split with the ELCA in the middle of a Capital Campaign and lost some of our key members, who in many cases were friends and longtime associates, we showed resiliency and rebounded to be a strong congregation. I have always felt the love and support of the other members of Our Savior's. I believe that when we look beyond our own circumstances and our own personal needs and can truly focus on what best serves the entire body of our congregation as a fellowship of believers, that is when we are strongest, both as a congregation and as servants of our Lord. Now more than ever we need to pull together. We have some issues that we need to work through, and it has become apparent to me that two entirely different perspectives have developed regarding these issues. My observation is that both perspectives have basis, and that we need to be respectful of both perspectives and understand that one member's experience may be entirely different from another's. And like with most things in life, there may not be what will be viewed as a perfect path forward. That's okay though, because what is most important is not how perfectly we stumble ahead, but that we just move forward together in faith, as we have in the past under many different pastors, and as we must do now. And if we stay true to our faith, and true to our commitment to be a fellowship of believers, the perfection will come in time as God's plan plays out.

Your Council is in the midst of determining what our Next Steps may look like as we strive to move forward together in faith. At the time of this writing, there is a special Council meeting scheduled for June 29th where your Council will attempt to elect new Council members from those candidates who volunteered to be considered to fill the vacancies. We will also begin to assess the LCMC findings, the feedback we have received from members of the congregation, and our own personal experiences. We need your prayers as we struggle to make the hard decisions that will determine our Next Steps and hopefully put us on the best course for our congregation. In the meantime, let's keep doing the things that keep us moving forward; supporting our ministries, worshipping together, praying for our congregation, participating in church functions, and being kind and respectful to one another. Together we can be OSLC Strong!
