The Antidote for Grumbling By: Pastor Bruce Grentz

Grumbling – we all do it. Let's be honest. It's much easier to grumble than be thankful. As we come into November, how can we not think of Thanksgiving. One of my favorite holidays we stop long enough to at least enjoy a great meal of Turkey, mashed potatoes, green bean casserole, rolls, cranberry sauce and whatever else the cook throws in the mix. And we can't forget the ever-present pumpkin pie or should I say, "pumpkin spice" pie. Where did pumpkin spice come from? I think a marketing person at Starbucks thought of this trendy flavor. Am I grumbling? Maybe I am.

Grumbling does have some plusses to it. If we grumble enough, we don't have to do anything, particularly if people reward our behavior. What do I mean? Well, others reward our negative behavior when they listen to our grumbling and agree that you've never had it so bad. Or better still they see you as some kind of triumphant victim, which takes you from victim to conqueror, with statements like, "I don't know how you deal with all this." No one would even know we were dealing with anything difficult if we hadn't grumbled within their earshot.

zo. The word means to murmur, mutter, grumble, say anything against in a low tone, of the cooing of doves, of those who confer secretly together, of those who discontentedly complain. If you remember this word was used of the Israelites when they were in the wilderness. In 1 Corinthians 10:10 Paul tells us, "**We must not put Christ**[c] **to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents,** ¹⁰ **nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer.**" They didn't like the manna God provided them in the wilderness nor did they obey his commands while getting sand in their eyes, hair, clothes and everywhere. Must have been rough but they forgot how good God had been to them by getting them out of Egypt and on their way to the promised land.

How could they have done better? Certainly, they needed a memory course on their deliverance from Egypt. The Passover meal was supposed to do that for them but true to form even with the Passover, they forgot how good God had been to them. Maybe rather than simply remembering what happened, they needed to do something that would improve their memories and their attitudes.

What was that for them and is that for us? Being thankful for everything God has done, is doing and will do in the future for us. Often, we want to know what God's will is. There is at least one place where His will is explicitly stated – I Thessalonians 5:18. There Paul tells us what God's will is. He says, "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Notice he says give thanks in all circumstances. All in the Greek means all. Yes, that's right, even the bad times. Why be thankful for the bad times? Because "we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28). We also know that even though people might mean things as evil against us, God means them for good. (Genesis 50:20)

Being thankful is the cure for grumbling. Paul was sitting in a prison in Rome and could have grumbled to God about what was happening to him. But he didn't. Instead, he gave thanks for the believers he had established there. He opened his letter to them by giving thanks. He said this in verses 3-5, "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, ⁴ always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, ⁵ because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." Paul could have grumbled about being in prison but instead he gave thanks to God for the believers at Philippi. Being thankful to God in all circumstances is the antidote to grumbling. As we enter November may we not only be thankful on Thanksgiving day but every day as Paul was for the believers at Philippi.
