Council Presidents Corner

It has been both an honor and a privilege to serve our awesome God, and to serve OSLC and its members in a role I believe God positioned me to be in, as your Council President. I thank all of you for giving me this wonderful opportunity, I hope I have served you well. This will be my final Newsletter article in that capacity, and I would like to take the opportunity to look back and reflect on those two years, as well as looking at how those two years have positioned our church to move forward.

Two years ago, I knew that there was work to be done, but little did I know how challenging and humbling of an experience it would be. Based on many personal interactions with Pastor Grentz, I believed I had a good understanding of issues that existed when I was elected to the role of Council President, and I believed I could work with the rest of the Council to quickly put them to bed. It turned out to be not that simple. After taking the time to actually visit with and to listen to members who had concerns, and to research the issues in more depth and to put them into clearer context, it was apparent that the problem was of a greater magnitude, ran far deeper, and had been going on far longer than I could have imagined. Even within our congregation, people's experiences and perceptions, and the opinions derived from those experiences and perceptions, were vastly different. And as serious and real as the concerns were, they did not necessarily directly affect the entire congregation. It became clear that there would be no quick and easy resolution, and that satisfying every member of our congregation would be difficult. There would need to be tough, prayerful decisions by the Congregational Council made in the best overall interests of Our Savior's Lutheran Church and its members.

Even as your Council tried to address issues and find a way to work through them, we also put in a great amount of time and effort to keep the congregation together and moving forward. We oversaw the revamping of our ministries to make them more effective, we gained approval to utilize Building Fund money to upgrade/improve our facilities, and we encouraged and supported church functions and events. Lenten dinners, Wine & Cheese, VBS, Steak Fry, Golf for the Son, Family Promise, Alpha Food Drive, Collection of School Supplies, and Oktoberfest are just some of the special events/functions that took place over the past two years along with the other regular functions of our ministries. I believe even with some distractions in the background and despite some isolated circumstances, that we as a church have indeed continued to be a welcoming fellowship of believers who proclaim the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, and who, through our support of and connecting with each other, the local community, and children of God everywhere, strive to love Christ and all others.

So here we are, with our pastor having recognized the need to end his call, now in a transition period as we go through the process to find a new pastor who can be an effective spiritual leader to every member of our congregation. We can choose to dwell on past circumstances or choose to focus on moving forward; this transition presents another challenge for our congregation, but also an opportunity for our members to rise to the occasion to sustain our church. And rise you have! So many of you are stepping

up to fill specific roles, and so many of you are stepping up in other ways. In my 20+ years as a member of OSLC, the strength and resiliency of the committed members of our congregation has never ceased to amaze me, and I continue to be amazed. Even though we come from different backgrounds and have different experiences, even though we all have our own personal situations, and even though each of us may be at a different point on our spiritual journey, we all share a common faith and come together to be Our Savior's Lutheran Church. I thank all of you for your commitment, dedication, and support. Each of us is important to God's plan for his church here in Roy, Utah, and each of us has something, however large or small, to offer.

I wish all of you a Happy and Prosperous New Year! I am looking forward to serving you all for one more year on the Congregational Council, and in whatever other capacity I may be called to serve. You are my church family, and **TOGETHER WE ARE OSLC STRONG!**
