Chance Daily was standing by the door welcoming them. The service had already started, the church was packed, the congregation was standing and singing along with the organ, and they sounded like a large angel's choir in heaven to Ellen. Tears started streaming down her cheeks and she knew she had come home.

Our Savior's became Steve and Ellen's church family, and all in this family, we hope, are part of Christ's church whose member's names are written in the book of life.

Our Savior's Lutheran Church has changed a lot since that long ago Sunday morning when Ellen first walked in. Young people have replaced our generation which is mostly no longer with us. But one thing must never change. This church is and always must be our Savior's church. That means that His will must be done, not our will.

Ellen was still a very small child when she found there were two of her, a good one and a bad one. She found the other Ellen in the large mirror in her parents' bedroom. Ellen was the good one and the one in the mirror was the bad one. They had the most interesting conversations. The good one wanted to do what Ellen's parents told her, and the bad one wanted to disobey. Since she had to do the talking for both, Ellen knew of course that she was both of them.

Most, or maybe all of us, have these two, the good and the bad inside us. Even when we are followers of Christ. That's why Jesus taught us to pray: "and deliver us from evil", because evil is still lurking inside us. We do not love God with our whole heart, and we do not love our neighbor as ourselves. So, we do not keep the commandment that Christ set before us as the most important: We do not love those who always want to have their own way, who do not respect our needs and who say things that hurt our feelings. We pray: "your Kingdome come", but we are not yet God's kingdom people. We need to be delivered, and for God to deliver us we must see our need.

Can we see that because we are not the people God wants us to be, members left our church family to start another church, so that now there are two churches. Two churches loved by God, who wants to make us a people who can truly love God and all others.

Let us embrace the members of New Hope Lutheran Church by being prayerfully supportive and let's forgive the way we hope to be forgiven. May God's blessing put joy into our hearts.
