

## Council President's Corner

Greetings from your Council President

As we move into spring, is it fair to say that a lot of excitement is surrounding Our Savior's? The Holy Spirit has increasingly kindled a fire in this congregation.

This interim period, while we await God's revealing of who will be the next "Shepherd" of us "sheep," is providing us great

opportunities to grow and support our ministries and our church. We are moving forward in a methodical way as we learn from each other how to avoid impatience and to fully embrace trust.

We had a very successful Lenten season. It was exciting to see and hear so many of our members stepping up to lead the "I AM" reflections for our Wednesday evening services. There was great fellowship at the meals held before the services. Diane, our guest organist, said it well: "It is so nice to hear everyone and then to reflect even more".

The call committee has been meeting weekly and filtering the applications that we have received. So far there have been six candidates that have applied for our open position. We have also reached out to five other possible candidates. The call committee will keep the congregation informed, as much as is appropriate. We are all eager for the time when the call committee can present the candidate that they believe is the Lord's choice for Our Savior's. What will follow is a request for endorsement by the council and then by the full congregation.

A special voters' meeting has been scheduled for April 21st, after our worship service. The purpose of this meeting is to vote on the amending of our Constitution and Bylaws. This hasn't been done since 2019. Please refer to the document that was distributed at the Annual meeting. Other options are to pick up a copy of these proposed documents in the Narthex or to request one be emailed to you.

There will be a new stained-glass window dedicated on May 5<sup>th</sup>, in memory of long-time deceased member Gail Mclaughlin. Donations are being accepted in a special container in the back, or you can mark your donation "Stained-Glass Window" and place it in the offering plate. Any donations over the cost of the window will be given to an organization focused on domestic violence prevention.

It has been a blessing to contact the various pastors to conduct services during our vacancy. It was refreshing to have them come to our church to share the word in their own unique style. OSLC has been blessed by having so many willing to step up and deliver the Word.

We are growing! We have reinstated six previous members to active membership, have added one new member, and one associate member. This is indicative of our being **OSLC STRONG**. The Lord is blessing us abundantly and I am grateful for the opportunity to serve.

## Lay Leader's Message

#### How should we pray?

Have you heard of the "I Don't Know Prayer"? You talk to God and tell Him all of the things you don't know, like what is happening with your job or the stock market or house prices, what that medical test result will be, or how a friend is faring. Tell God everything you don't know. Then end the prayer with this, "But You know!" And you leave it there. Leave everything

you are wondering about or worried about at the foot of the cross.

Cool, huh? Is it real? Is that really the way to pray? In Sunday School I learned to fold my hands, close my eyes, and bow my head. Thinking back, that might have been the only way the teacher could get us all quiet. My parents picked up on it and made it happen at home, too. At meals: "Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest, and let thy gifts to us be blessed." I was much older when I realized the Gifts were Food, even if I didn't like the food.

Is that the way to pray?

John 17:1 says Jesus looked toward Heaven and prayed. In Matthew 26:39 He prayed with His face to the ground. Eyes closed or open, head bowed or looking up, standing, sitting, or lying down?

As a teen I learned to be distraction free so I can ask humbly and listen with both ears. Some people have prayer closets in their houses; maybe it's on the porch or in the garage. Avoiding sights, sounds, tastes, smells, and touch might sharpen your ability to feel God. Sometimes I wrap myself in a Prayer Shawl as I move about the house quietly to remind myself that I am in communication with God. And sometimes I am singing along with a Christian song - on the radio - at the top of my lungs - while I am driving! No isolation of senses there!

Is that a prayer?

The Psalms are prayers that were sung and chanted. Sometimes when music is played at OSLC it's hard NOT to feel the Holy Spirit and realize we are speaking with God through that song! Quietly or loudly?

Let's get Biblical with a few examples.

Old Testament. The Lord appeared to Solomon in 2 Chronicles 7:14, telling him that He would forgive the sins of His people if they would humble themselves and pray. Before Nehemiah asked the King who was holding him captive if he could go back to Judah, he prayed a silent prayer, Nehemiah 2:4-5. Hannah prayed silently for a child in 1 Samuel 1:10-13.

New Testament. At seeing Jesus, Simeon and Anna praised God aloud for all to hear in Luke 2:25-38. Before telling Lazarus to come out of the grave where he had been for 4 days, Jesus prayed aloud for the benefit of the onlookers, John 11:40-44. In Mark 1:35 Jesus got up early and went off alone to pray. He prayed by himself at night in Matthew 14:23. When the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray, in chapter 6, verses 9-13, Matthew records what we call the Lord's Prayer. Read it beginning with verse 5 to get the whole story. Jesus told them they should always pray and not give up in Luke 18:1.

After Jesus. Paul says to pray on all occasions, all kinds of prayers and requests, praying for all of the Lord's people in Ephesians 6:18. See some of Paul's other thoughts about prayer in Philipians 4:4-6, Colossians 4:2, and 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18. Timothy tells us to lift up Holy hands, without anger or disputing in 1 Tim. 2:8. James tells how to pray in chapter 5:13-18. Matt 18:20 advises to pray together, 2 or more.

Perhaps Romans 8:26 is most telling. "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans." Wordless groans, silently, aloud, at the top of my lungs, with bowed head, looking up to heaven, with lifted hands, together, alone, ... with a humble heart. No matter how: Just talk to God. Pray for yourself, your family, friends and strangers. Pray for OSLC's Council, employees, and Call Committee. Pray for our ministry leaders and members. Pray for all of God's people and that all others will be led to Him.

1 John 5:14 "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us."

God knows your heart. His will be done. However, you choose to pray, just remember that God listens and HE KNOWS!


