## Pastor's Message From Our Lay Leader's

When I led the Worship Service on August 4<sup>th</sup>, I was led by the Spirit to focus the message on that week's 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading, from Chapter 4 of Paul's letter to the Ephesians. As most of you know, I have been encouraging the congregation to stay strong during this current period of transition and to continue to thrive in the absence of a called pastor. I think that Paul had a similar message in his letter to the Church in Ephesus, and this message is as relevant for us as it was to the Ephesians. We continue to need members to step up and use their gifts to meet the needs of our church and to support our ministries.

However, that message also speaks on a much a grander scale. Our own church united in faith and in a shared mission will just make one strong member of the much larger church body of which Christ is the head. For that larger church body to be strong, the different members, or parts or individual congregations, must not only be strong individually, but they must also sync together in order to be best equipped to serve God's universal ministry. In fact, the unity between the different parts of the body, the syncing together, may even be more critical than the individual strength of any congregation.

Remember, Paul wasn't just administering to that one church in Ephesus, he was planting and encouraging and building up a broad network of congregations that would eventually turn the pagan world upside down. As I look around our world today, I sense that it may be at a point where it again needs to be turned upside down, where current approaches and methods may no longer be most effective. We may need new ministry models that use Paul's "network" approach to connect believers to join forces to become a more potent deterrent against the pervasive evils of our modern culture.

The call process that we are in the midst of may very well be about far more than just finding a new pastor. I know God has a plan for Our Savior's, and that He will lead the Pastor to our church who He wants to shepherd our congregation. In His way and in His time. However, I also believe that God may very well be using the call process to prepare us for a new path, although exactly where He is leading us remains to be seen. Perhaps God even has a new ministry model or something innovative in His plans for us. Whatever He has planned though, what we are learning in this period of transition, and even what was learned from our previous experience that led to this period of transition, is all preparing us for that next phase of the journey. Together we are OSLC strong, but


even more important than being strong, we are becoming resilient and flexible. I believe we are becoming better prepared to step out of the box and better equipped to take on whatever God has planned for our church as we move forward in faith.

I said before that I believe that God has a plan for Our Savior's, and that He will lead the Pastor to our church who He wants to shepherd our flock. Our Call Committee is being very diligent in their search and the Council is providing excellent leadership. As I mentioned before though, this Pastor that God has planned may be part of a much larger plan for our church and may not be what all of us expect. This pastor may also be called to lead our congregation in a direction that we have not envisioned. In fact, some of us may not envision being led someplace new at all; we may want to remain hunkered down in the comfort of green pastures beside the still waters. But I plead with every member and friend of Our Savior's to keep an open mind and an open heart about where the Lord may lead. The green pastures beside the still waters are just one wayside on the journey as the Good Shepherd leads us on the paths of righteousness. We need to let the Holy Spirit take the wheel and try not to be backseat drivers.

I personally am excited to see what lies ahead. If it was anyone else's plan but God's, or anyone else driving besides the Holy Spirit, I'd be both a little nervous and a little afraid; because I know there will be some discomfort and challenges to deal with in what the future holds, God's Holy Word foretells of nothing less. But I am on this journey with a wonderful fellowship of believers, and I know that we can put our full trust in the LORD and know that our final destination will be worth the journey!

TOGETHER WE ARE OSLC STRONG! **Not for our glory, but for the glory of our awesome GOD!** 

Please, keep your hearts and your minds open and continue in prayer as we wait for God's plan for our church to unfold.


