Pastor's Message From Our Lay Leader's

Psalm 103

If you haven't read this Psalm in a while, I encourage you to do so. I am highlighting a few verses here, but the whole Psalm is a treasure!

103:1 Praise the Lord, my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name.

*Have you ever caught yourself praying, maybe a corporate prayer we've all memorized, and not really thinking the words? Squirrel! How easily I am distracted! This verse says to me: As often as I can I need to praise God with EVERYTHING I've got!

*Count your blessings! On Election Day, we will all be thanking God for democracy. Many in the 2024 world still live under dictatorships and tyranny, inequity and unjust governments. On November 11, we will be thanking God for our Veterans and their sacrifices. We will thank Him for birthdays and anniversaries as the month moves on. We say special thanks on Thanksgiving Day! These Psalm verses tell me that every day I need to remember what God has done for me - bigger and better than the earthly things I thank Him for. Thank God I am forgiven! God only knows (literally) all the benefits He gives me on a regular basis, all the sins I commit, all the diseases I carry in my body and mind. He forgives all; he heals all. I am saved from the pit of hell through His love and compassion. I certainly don't DESERVE to be forgiven! I fail him daily. He gives me good things and renews me daily. Thank God!


11 For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; 12 as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

*Our flight over the Atlantic Ocean did not take us as high as the heavens, but our Europe land trip took us from Utah, USA in the west to Istanbul, Turkey (Asia) in the east. Twelve countries, three continents and we saw God everywhere! Jewish synagogues, Roman Catholic Cathedrals, and small, neighborhood churches. We found ornate, medieval, highly artistic, beautifully decorated 500-year-old churches and very simple, dedicated to the Reformation led by Martin Luther, Protestant churches. We didn't find any cites where a church was not mentioned in the visitor's tours. And if you know Elton, you know we talked to plenty of people (locals and travelers like us) about the book of John, a firsthand account of when Jesus was alive on the Earth. Everywhere we went we prayed before meals; we wore our crosses and we celebrated that God has removed our transgressions from us. 8 The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love.

9 He will not always accuse, nor will he harbor his anger forever;

10 he does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. *Thank God!

22 Praise the Lord, all his works everywhere in his dominion. Praise the Lord, my soul. Amen.



SAMARITAN'S PURSE OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

 Many of you look forward to filling shoeboxes each year. I know I do. I like to fill one box for a boy and one box for a girl. Every shoebox is a special opportunity to tell a child about God's love, and His Son, Jesus Christ.



- There are labels at the back of the church that have information on them to help you know what items to fill your shoebox with. The labels also note what items should not be placed in the shoe boxes, such as food, candy or gum, and liquids such as toothpaste and lotion.
- There is a \$10 donation per box requested to help cover shipping and other project costs.
- Any type of shoebox or shoe box sized box is acceptable. If you have extra shoeboxes at home, they work fine, or you can purchase an inexpensive plastic shoebox at the dollar store. If you have extra shoeboxes at home, you can bring them in to donate, and someone else may be able to use them.

Trunk or Treat - Transition team will be sponsoring a trunk to hand out microwave popcorn, that is labeled "Thanks for Poppin in", OSLC info and QR code, etc. for all participants! We will be assembling those on Oct. 24th at 5:15 in the Fellowship Hall

Alpha Food Drive - annually for at least 3 decades, Our Savior's has coordinated a collection for food and basic household necessities for the benefit of individuals and families in our community who are deeply struggling with the cost of living. To that end, members of OSLC have been assigned a month, thus creating 12 groups. Each group (Hospitality Team) has as leader and 5-8 individuals or families. These teams are asked to donate a variety of essential items which are brought to the Fellowship Hall. <u>Saturday, December 14th</u> these items will be bundled for delivery. On that same date, perishable items will be purchased utilizing monetary donations. Following Sunday service, <u>December 15th</u>, the bundles will be delivered.

At this time, it is appropriate that you consider who in your sphere of influence might need and also be receptive to becoming a recipient. Last year we had 9 families, who received bundles. Application forms are on the back counter and can be emailed to you or mailed to you. Please turn these forms into Mary Kartak.

In the next few weeks, you will be contacted by your month's team leader to remind you of the items you are asked to contribute donation. A binder is provided with that same information on the back counter. Donating is deeply appreciated, if you are able. Tables will be provided in the Fellowship Hall for your donations. If you find that you cannot contribute this year, please know that no record is kept. If you can donate more, fabulous! The cost of items identified has increased and the intention of Alpha Food Drive is to create an avenue of sharing, not to impose a burden. Prayer is a wonderful donation, if that better fits your circumstances!


