



One activity to immediately consider is to join our Prayer Warrior Team and pray for those in need.






OUR ELITE AT HOME

STEWARDSHIP DRIVE

Peace and Blessings Members of Our Savior's,

As the Vice-President of the Congregational Council, I am responsible for the Stewardship Drive which typically takes place in October. In an October Newsletter article, I mentioned that I would do things a little differently this year, but would be sending out a communication with opportunities for you to contribute your time, talents, and financial donations to support our church.

I have intentionally delayed that communication for two reasons:

- 1. I believe that members of Our Savior's have already stepped up in wonderful ways to keep our church thriving during this period of transition while we are in the Call Process to find a new pastor. We have proven time and time again that we are strong as a church, and that a Stewardship Drive isn't required to get people to step up and serve when and where there is a need.
- 2. With the current economy and the inflation we have experienced, I know some people are still adjusting to the rising costs of goods and services and may find it difficult to make a firm financial commitment in our current situation. Also, our level of giving has remained fairly steady and is more than sufficient to meet our present budgetary needs. However, I will be upfront with everyone, as I have always tried to be, and forewarn you that when the time comes to call a new pastor, the budget will be much tighter, and at that time you may be requested to make an increased financial commitment as a basis for offering a fair compensation package to a new pastor. When that time comes, the Financial Team will crunch the numbers and let everyone know what is needed.

So why now for this communication? Many of us like to make New Year's resolutions, and rather than make perhaps nonconsequential resolutions that you may or may not feel committed to keep, I think that committing your time and talents to support our church would make an excellent resolution that benefits not only you, but others as well. Attached is a worksheet with a list of church activities that you can check off if you may be interested in or want to make a commitment to support. Please note, checking off an activity is not an obligation or a commitment, it only means that you will be contacted and given the opportunity to pitch in as you are able with your time and talents.

Please review the entire worksheet, as there are a whole host of activities which may tickle your fancy. More more hands are always welcome and appreciated:

- Prayer Warriors, praying for the needs of those requested by members and friends Our Savior's
- Communion Assistants, helping set up and take down before and after Worship Service
- Praise Band, looking for not just more hands, but also more voices! If you have instrumental or vocal skills of any level, Wendy would love to put those skills to work
- All the other activities listed on the Time & Talent Survey Completed surveys, whether you check off one box or several, can be placed in the collection basket during Offertory at the Sunday Worship Service, or turned into the Church Office or to any member of Council

I would like to end this correspondence in an atypical manner for a Stewardship Drive communication. Rather than coerce you to contribute more, I want to convey my sincere appreciation for all the support already given, both to keep Our Savior's Lutheran Church thriving and to make it such a great place to come join in fellowship as we praise, worship, and serve our awesome God. I also want to express my supreme confidence that we will all continue to support our church in every way that is needed.




