There is no greater time period in any year, for me, than the one we are in now!!! Which "year" am I talking about? The weather year? The anniversary of your birth year? The church year? Whatever part of the year you want to languish in. The weather year in Utah has the hope of spring coming. Your birth year could be with the hope of receiving something(s). My favorite one is the Church Year. It guides the colors on the Altar throughout the year, it gives us ideas of what songs to sing, and in general helps keep us on track.

Officially, Lent is the 40 weekdays from Ash Wednesday to Easter as observed by the Roman Catholic, Eastern and some Protestant churches. Being a life-long Lutheran, I have had many years' experiences with the Church year. In my younger years Lent was set aside for penitence and fasting. There was such a prevalence of Catholics and Protestants, it was "expected" everyone was practicing these same observing.

When I was in elementary school EVERYONE in the Minnesota farming community, I grew up in, ONLY ate fish on Friday's. That's even what restaurants served on Friday's, if you when out to eat and that was what was served in school lunches. There were lots of other practices that came along with Lent.

As things do, over time, they change. I've noticed, many religious people have started putting a little different twist on the "penitence" part of Lent, and replaced it with giving of time, food, clothing, help to senior citizens in lieu of "giving up something".

How do we Lutherans get from the solemnness of Lent to Easter. Please allow me some license to condense several items here. Many important teachings of Christ and the apostles are told of in the chapters between the starting of Lent and Easter including the entrance of Jesus to Jerusalem as commemorated by Palm Sunday. There are many examples in these writings about what God wants His message for us to be.

We are coming upon Good Friday. The commemoration of the day Christ was hung on the Cross after being given up to the Roman soldiers. Yes, even this is an exciting time for me! I first heard this story with vivid description of dark skies, thunder and lightning. The drapes in the Temple were shredded. This telling left such an impression on me, I can still feel the drama surrounding the telling of this story.

Then, what happened after 3 days? Christ arose from the dead and appeared to many people. To me this is the promise God gave to us and is the real reason we worship at all.

## Monthly Devotional By: Thomas Curtin

The Easter story as told through the 24<sup>th</sup> chapter of Luke is relatable to us as a story of how the resurrection of Jesus perseveres as a promise to us for our salvation. His steadfast love for us endures forever!

As Christians, we do what we can to live in Christ, as saints made in his image inspired by the Holy Spirit to love others. But the urge to sin can often overtake us imperfect people. We are constantly distracted by our own lives and our own self-interests.

In our Easter reading, the women in Jesus's life visit His tomb and are confronted by angels with news of the resurrection. Even after hearing the joyful news from the women returning from the tomb that Jesus had risen from the dead, the apostles regarded this news as an 'idle tale,' and continued to live their lives in fear of what was to come and in mourning for their friend on the road to Emmaus. To emphasize that uncertainty, Peter in his doubt had to return to Christ's empty tomb to witness it for himself.

Even though we know of our Savior's resurrection through Scripture, our response can be to doubt what God has planned for us, and to feel a need to confirm with our own senses that we are saved. Sometimes our struggle is to move on with our lives without taking the hope of the resurrection into our hearts. I doubt that I am alone in saying that I am not thinking of Easter in the middle of November, and that I do not live my whole life with the idea in the forefront of my mind that God was so selfless that He sent His son to die for us. The bondage to sin is impossible for us to get out of without the suffering on the cross and resurrection of our Lord. But because God has saved us from that bondage, we are Christians who live in the miracle of Easter. He has rescued you; you are forever His, and the loving relationship you have with Him is sealed.

Now, you may think that the message of this devotional is to try to live your life so that Christ is in your every waking thought, and to keep His salvation and grace alone in your heart in everything you do. On the contrary, I am writing this to inform you that you are relieved, through the cross, of that impossible standard. God loves you so much for who you are, even with all your imperfections. It is out of your hands. God will do everything for you. He is powerful enough to save you from everything and no matter what you do, you are already living every day in the good news of Easter, regardless of what is going on in your life and whatever you are struggling with!

So, throughout this month, year, and the rest of your life, when you think of the salvation we receive from God, remember, it is not because you are following some rule to live in Christ, but because God is gracious enough to let you feel His Holy Spirit. His news and His word are powerful, and when you are reminded of your relationship with Christ, it is in love.

God is working with and through you. He has made you His forever, and in times when you remember Easter, and even in times when you do not, Christ is Risen! Amen.

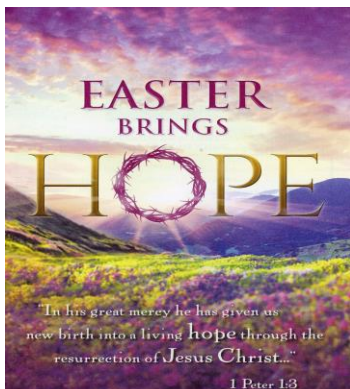

I = is it INSPIRING

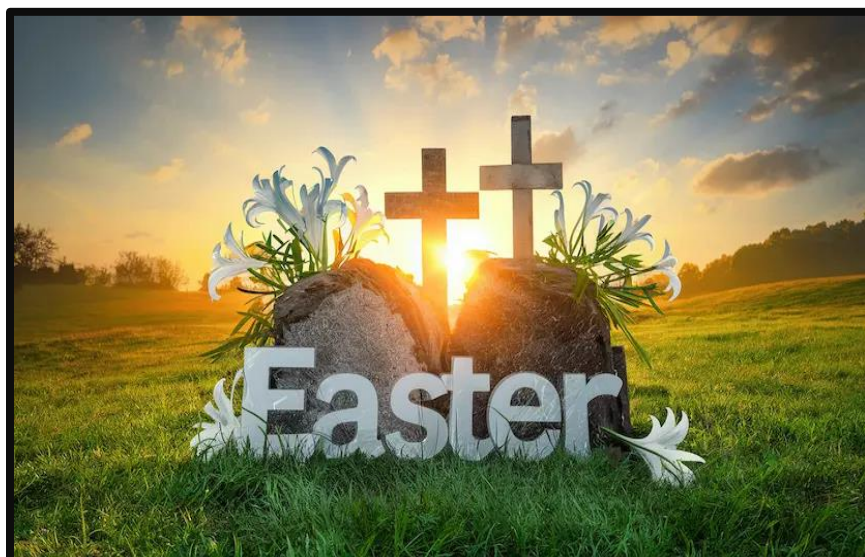
N = is it NECESSARY

Several references for this thought! This one is powerful. Psalms 34:13 "Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from telling lies"

Communication = observing, speaking, listening and empathizing with others is` part of God's plan to love others as ourselves.

- Sometimes the greatest gift you can give, is to include them.
- What is this person's most endearing quality?
- Give each other the gift of time! Whoever you are with, wherever you are "be there".

## Easter Story Cookies

1 Cup whole pecans	Zipper baggie
1 tsp Vinegar	Wooden Spoon
3 Egg Whites	Tape
Pinch Salt	Bible

Preheat oven to 300 (this is important, do not wait until you are half done with the recipe).

Place pecans in zipper baggie and let the children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, He was beaten by the Roman Soldiers. Read John 19:1-3

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put 1 tsp vinegar into mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross, He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:29-30.

Add egg whites to the vinegar, eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. Read John 10:10-11.

Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest in the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. Read Luke 23:27.

So far the ingredients are not very appetizing. Add 1 Cup sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Psalm 34:8 and John 3:16.

Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eye of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.





Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto a wax-paper covered cookie sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matthew 27:57-60.

Put the cookie sheet in oven, close the door, and turn the oven off. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matthew 27:65-66.

Go to bed!

Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in there overnight. Explain Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20 and 22.

On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow. Explain on the first easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. Read Matthew 28:1-9

When Jesus' friends got to the tomb they found an angel who told them Jesus was alive! Luke 24:2-7



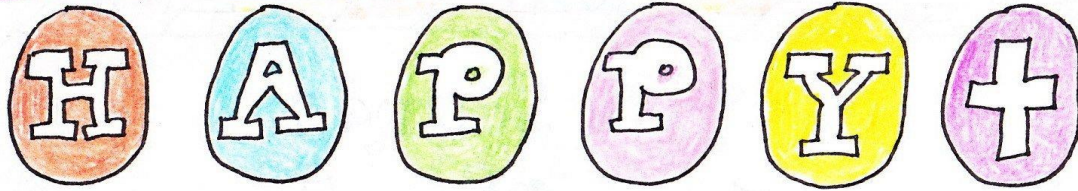
