**Monthly Devotional**

Anyone who lives in Utah knows about drought and its effects on the thirsty land. When the snow doesn't come in the winter and rain is short in the summer, the ground becomes dry and cracked. Our reservoirs drop, rivers shrink and everything begins to struggle for life. With these types of conditions, we become aware of just how precious water really is and how devastating it can be without it.

When that valuable moisture does come, we can see a dramatic change. Dry soil softens, rivers rise and life begins to return around us.

Just like dry land, our hearts can experience a drought without a relationship with God. We become spiritually dry. We can lack peace, purpose, and joy. People may try to fill that emptiness with work, entertainment, money or success but like dry ground, the thirst remains.

In John 7:37-39 Jesus calls out to those who are thirsty. He declares that he alone is the source of living water.

He doesn't offer just a little relief - He promises living water, a living water that never runs dry. This living water is the Holy Spirit. Living inside us, the Spirit continually renews, refreshes and sustains us, by bringing life and strength to our hearts. Just like rain can transform a drought-stricken landscape, the Holy Spirit can satisfy the deepest thirst of the human soul.

What is even more amazing about Jesus' promise is that the water doesn't just satisfy our thirst, it flows out of us and affects those around us. He doesn't merely meet our needs; He transforms us into a source of life for others, through our words, actions, love and witness.

Just remember "a stagnant pool keeps water to itself. A living stream flows." The Christian life was never meant to be contained; it is meant to overflow.

When your heart feels dry and empty, remind yourself to come to the Lord. He will fill you with living water. You will be refreshed. Then your life will become like a river that brings love and hope to others.

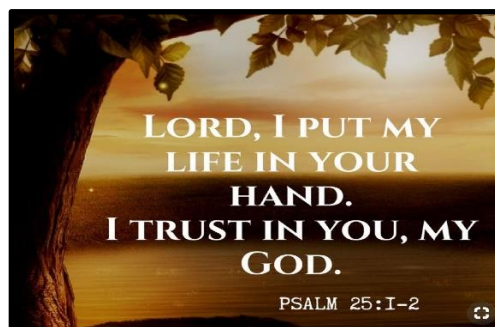

**Easter Is Over — Now What?**

The empty tomb still echoes with hope, but the lilies have wilted, the special services are over, and the crowds have gone home. Easter has passed... so what happens now? The good news is that the message of Easter was never meant to be a one-day celebration. It's the beginning of a way of life.

**1. Keep Celebrating the Resurrection:** Easter Sunday may be behind us, but the **resurrection power of Jesus continues every day**. Scripture reminds us that God often works in the ordinary just as powerfully as in the extraordinary. We don't worship a risen Savior only once a year — we worship Him because He is alive every single day.

So let's carry that same joy, gratitude, and expectation into the "regular" Sundays ahead. Jesus is no less worthy of our worship today than He was on Easter morning.

**2. Rest and Renew:** Lent and Easter seasons are beautiful but demanding seasons for volunteers, staff, and leaders. Many poured themselves out so others could encounter Jesus. If you served, thank you. Take a breath. Let God refill what you poured out.

**3. Look Ahead With Purpose:** Now is the time for our congregation to lean into what God is doing next. What will and can we do as a continuation of resurrection life?

**4. Live as Easter People:** Ultimately, the answer to "Now what?" is simple: **We live as people shaped by the resurrection**. We love boldly. We serve joyfully. We worship faithfully. We share hope generously.

Easter isn't over — it's ongoing. Christ is risen, and because He lives, our lives, our church, and our community can be transformed day by day.

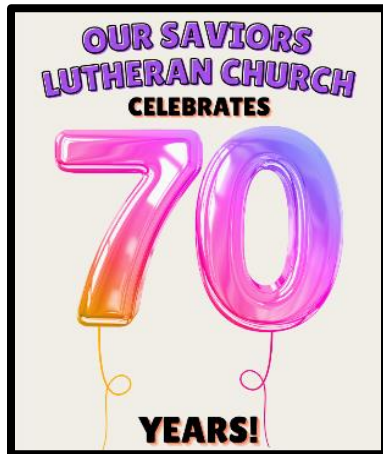
Wendy is putting together some song selections for a "sing along". If you have requests, please pass them on to Wendy Nelson.

From some classrooms in an elementary school to the sanctuary and fellowship/education building we have now, OSLC has come a long way in seventy years!

Do you remember or have you wondered where some of our pieces and parts came from?

There are two gorgeous stained glass windows between the sanctuary and narthex, above the door at the center aisle. One depicts Jesus in prayer with the light of the Father shining down on Him. A dove flies above him. All three parts of the Trinity are represented. The other window shows Jesus as Our Shepherd who takes care of us and guides us to the truth and the light. These were a gift from Glade and Alpha Nielsen, long time members of OSLC in memory of their youngest son, Lance, who died in an auto accident in 1996. These windows can remind all of us of John 10 and Psalm 23.

Look at the tapestry of the Last Supper on the side wall near the narthex. The husband of one of Debbye Boe's friends purchased this in Singapore years ago when he was stationed there. He gave it to his mother, and it hung in her house until she died. After that, Debbye's friends did not have room in their house for it. They listed it on Facebook and asked if anyone was interested. Debbye immediately said YES, and gave it to the church in 2021.

The small stained glass windows in the sanctuary predate both of those art works with its own art and special meanings. Each one has a different representation. Do you know the symbols and their meanings? Many of us were here in 2024 when a new one was dedicated in honor of Gail Ann Jones-McLaughlin after she was killed in 2023. Purple was her favorite color and ironically the color representing domestic violence. Carpet has changed, choir seats became band area, banners are changed in season, and even pews have changed.

Which architectural aspects of OSLC are your favorites? Since the fellowship/education building was there first, all of the other parts are additions! We have seen the area between the two buildings grow and change several times.

Thank God we have had a safe, comfortable, Christ serving church to attend, grow in, worship, and praise together in for seventy years!

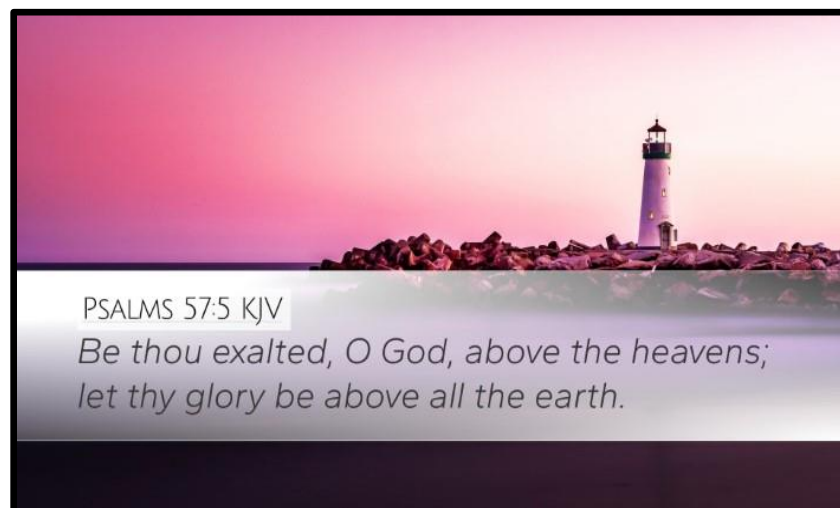
